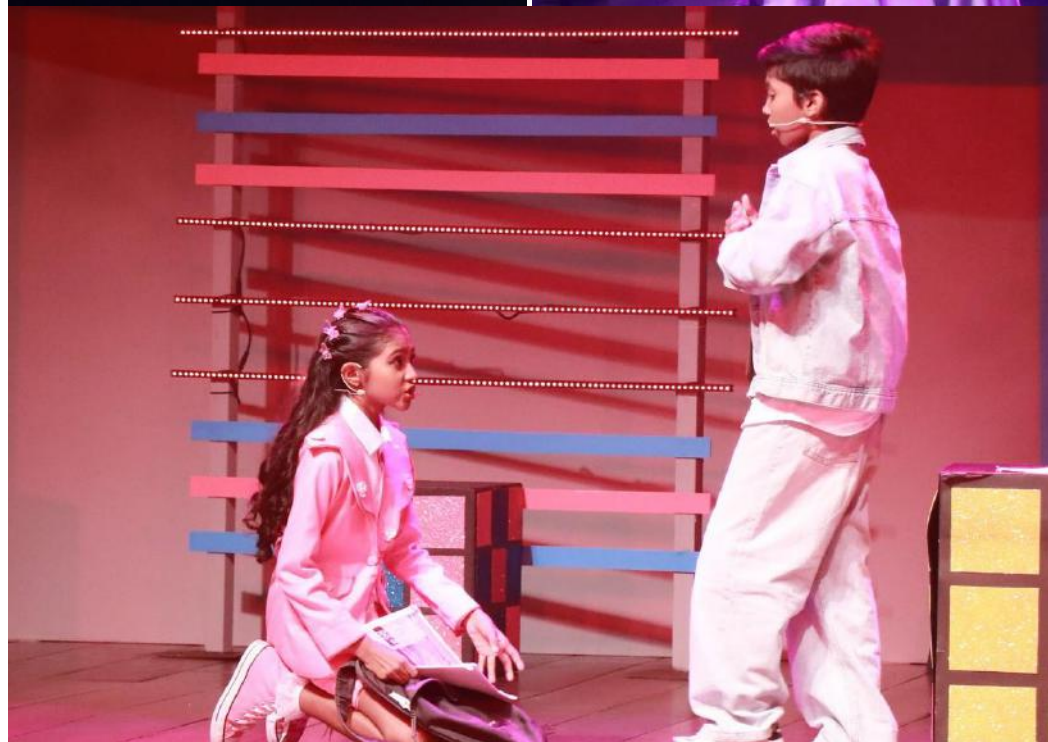

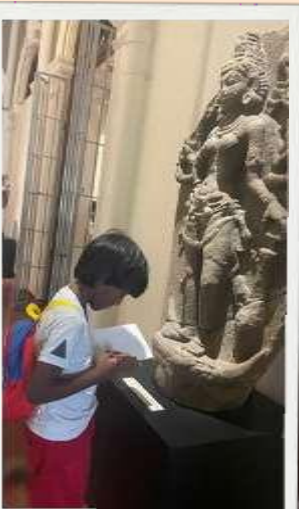


TRIP TO THE MUSEUM

The Wetlands Day adventure began with an introduction to the park by the fantastic coordinators from the Wild Kids of the Wildlife and Nature Protection Society. They shared fascinating insights about the wetland and how it is home to many different animals, migratory birds and marshy plants. The coordinators were incredibly knowledgeable and were keen to share their expertise with the children.



Armed with notebooks and a keen eye, students were given the task of recording their own field notes as they explored this amazing conservation area, recording the flora and fauna they observed such as wetland birds, butterflies, dragonflies, amphibians, and reptiles.



Near the end of their walk through the wetlands, students had the opportunity to go up the bird-watching tower, which offered breathtaking panoramic views of the wetlands. Students scanned the skies and marshes below, hoping to catch a glimpse of soaring birds and secretive creatures.
